COURSE DESCRIPTION

MODULE - ANATOMY/PHYSIOLOGY (250 HOURS)

MODULE - Digestive System *Chapters* 24 – 25

You will have a complete understanding of the function of digestion for practical application. Metabolism and nutrition is added to aid the student's ability to translate the A & P into everyday terms.

Chapter 1: An intro to the human body. Review only. The student is encouraged to read the synopsis of this chapter. In later modules this chapter will be reintroduced and is a requirement. Homeostasis brought up in the chapter is a key element in understanding the human makeup.

MODULE - Muscular & Skeleton Systems Chapters 6 – 11

Function, structure and histology of bone are reinforced in the chapter. The emphasis in this module is a general understanding of support and movement, and how it may have an impact on the over all quality of life style.

Chapter 2: The chemical level of organization. *Review only*. Keeping up with a complete system or physiology, will help guide you through your health career. It is important to have an understanding of inorganic and organic atom material. Here also you will get a glimpse of the importance of nutritional information necessary to be a competent professional.

MODULE - Cardiovascular System Chapters 19 – 21

The module is inclusive of the function and quality of blood, (cells, groups and blood marrow). It then explains the heart function, and the purpose of the structures making up the heart. Finally how the blood is transported through a series of vessels nourishing and rejuvenating the body.

Chapter 3: <u>The cellular level of organization</u>. *Review only*. Here we see how our bodies are joined together, and made into a working unit. Cell divisions, osmosis, cellular diversity, are all part of the exploration you find in this chapter.

MODULE - Lymphatic and Respiration Systems Chapters 22 – 23

The lymphatic system is the heart of our cleansing system and must be understood (as all the systems). An understanding of the immune system and how it protects us from foreign invaders (viruses, bacteria) are very relevant to the times we are living in. The respiratory system brings in the new generation of cells and the lymphatic system removes toe old.

Chapter 4: The tissue level or organization. Review only. Types of tissues and their origins help to understand how we are held together. Also how and what it will take to repair these tissues and restore homeostasis.

MODULE - Nervous System Chapters 12-17

Structure, function, and organization of the nervous system are presented. You will continue to gain knowledge of the brain function and the cranial nerves. After completing the nerves its application to sensory, motor, and the pathways are added, it completes a clinical study.
